- 2. Online entries must include breed, sex, color/variety and identification number (tag ld)
- 3. Entry fees are \$2.00 per entry, except as stated elsewhere.
- 4. Exhibitors are responsible for the daily care and feeding of their own animals during the hours posted. Adult assistance is not permitted except for safety of the exhibitor and/or animal on exhibit. Failure to care for animals daily may result in loss of awards/premiums.
